



# RI Rider Education Program

Welcome to the CCRI Motorcycle Rider Preparation Course. Our program is designed to provide you with the best training by the most qualified instructors on how to operate your motorcycle safely on Rhode Island highways.

## You can register in three ways:

Students will receive an email notification confirming their registration within 2 days if a legible, valid email address is provided on this form. If you do not receive notification, you can call one of our CWCE offices listed below to confirm your registration. It is necessary for you to provide all required information, except those fields noted as 'optional.'

**Faxed Registration:** Eligible students wishing to pay by credit card may fax a registration form to the Warwick Workforce & Community Education Office at **401-825-1116**.

**Mailed Registration:** Eligible students wishing to pay by check or money order (payable to CCRI) or by credit card may do so by mailing a registration form to: **CCRI, Center for Workforce & Community Education, Attn: RI Rider Education Program, 400 East Avenue, Room 4200, Warwick, RI 02886**.

**Walk-In Registration:** Eligible students wishing to pay by cash, check or money order (payable to CCRI), or credit card may register in person at one of the CCRI locations listed below. **Please Note:** You must attend and successfully complete all hours (16.5) of the program. We, therefore, ask that you carefully review your schedule to be sure you can attend all sessions. Rescheduling will result in delays and additional fees. If you do not appear for your first class or arrive late, you will forfeit your fee and you must re-register and pay the full registration fee. Classes begin promptly at the designated time. We suggest you arrive on campus 15 minutes before that time to locate the room and ensure readiness to begin. Room assignments are posted throughout the campus building. If you do not complete all hours (16.5) successfully by the final day of the program year (usually the end of October), you must re-register, pay full course fees, and take the entire class in the next year. There are no exceptions.

## Program and Safety Requirements

There are specific and stringent safety requirements of the Motorcycle Safety Program that must be followed. It is mandatory that all students bring the following to:

### Classroom Lectures:

- Pen or pencil, paper and your Valid Driver's License
- Highlighter

### Riding Ranges (*pertains to all CCRI Riding Programs*):

- Your Valid Driver's License
- DOT Certified Motorcycle Helmet (If you do not have a DOT helmet, arrive early, you may be able to borrow one. Please ask the instructor.)
- Long sleeve shirt or jacket, durable pants (such as jeans)
- Leather, full fingered gloves
- Eye protection – sun glasses or prescription glasses are ok; but, remember to bring clear lenses if ranges are at night. All eye protection must be made of safety glass.
- Over the ankle leather shoes with a good, non-slip sole.
- Bring snacks and refreshments to keep you alert and hydrated (breaks are given at the discretion of the instructor)
- Rain gear when needed – check the weather before you travel to class

Remember – You must dress according to the weather conditions. For colder months, dress in layers. During warmer months, long sleeve tee-shirts or button downs are acceptable. Five hours outdoors on bikes can be very uncomfortable if you are not dressed for the conditions. Failure to bring the appropriate items/gear to the range, failure to appear without notice and/or failure to arrive on time will result in your having to reschedule and pay a range rescheduling fee of \$60.00.

**Age Requirement:** 18 or older. If under 18, a 'Minor Release Agreement' form is available online at <http://www.ccri.edu/cwce/motorcycle>.

Finally, it is rare that a range is cancelled due to bad weather. Nevertheless, you may call the office one hour before the class to ensure that it is still meeting: Warwick, 825-1214 or Lincoln, 333-7070 – office hours in Warwick are Monday - Friday, 8am-4pm and in Lincoln are Monday – Thursday, 8am-6pm, Friday, 8am-4pm and Saturday, 9am-Noon. After office hours, call Campus Security: Warwick 825-2109 or Lincoln 333-7035.
